Known as the traditional territory of the Ojibwe Anishnabe aboriginal people, it includes several First Nations communities throughout the area.

In keeping with this indigenous perspective of connection to the land and its original inhabitants, Humber College is committed to increasing awareness and knowledge of the First Peoples of Canada.
