Take the opportunity to engage with the natural environment and learn the skills to make a real difference to the future of our planet.

New Zealand's stunning mountains, forests and waterways are the perfect setting for a life-changing overseas experience. Enhance your awareness and deepen your knowledge of one of the biggest global issues facing the modern world – sustainability.

The outdoors will become your classroom as you explore sustainability issues in one of New Zealand's most diverse wildlife ecosystems and the site of a world-leading ecosanctuary - Dunedin and its surrounding areas. Awareness of sustainability issues and the opportunity to actively participate in ecological restoration form the basis of this experience. The course culminates with a 'journey' – an expedition through some of New Zealand's most beautiful and untouched natural terrain.

Constructing Culture – Understanding a Bi-Cultural Perspective

Our world is a global village made up of numerous ethnic groups and diverse communities all co-existing in increasingly less-defined geographic regions. As individuals, we are increasingly aware of difference but can be uncertain of how to understand or co-exist alongside it. This can be particularly true when interacting with First Nation peoples. First Nation peoples occupy a unique space in any global village as their cultural practices, knowledge and understanding of the world do not exist in any other place.

Embark on a course that looks at the Kai Tahu tribe's relationship with the Crown through the 'The Treaty of Waitangi' - the founding document of New Zealand. You'll also have the opportunity to engage with unique cultural experiences such as staying on a Marae, the traditional meeting house of the Māori people.


Learn about the conditions that created contemporary New Zealand society and take advantage of this opportunity to examine and reflect on your own cultural context, and the relationships in the places we share.

Included:

- > Successful completion of this program is the equivalent of up to 2.0 lower level degree breadth elective credits from (Degree) or 2.0 GNED credits (Diplomas). Must be approved in advance by your Program Coordinator. Summer tuition fees are waived at Humber, and normal tuition will be due for the fall 2018 semester
- > Airport pickup and drop off from Dunedin New Zealand
- > Accommodation mainly with New Zealand Homestay family. Also includes camping expenses
- > Breakfast, lunch and dinner during the programme dates
- > Expenses for extracurricular activities and transportation for visits and transfers
- > Travel health insurance for the program dates

Not Included:

- > Roundtrip airfare (book your own flights)
- > Activity fees outside those included in the program itinerary
- > Incidentals, spending money
- > Baggage and trip cancellation insurance, if desired
- > Students who are not Canadian citizens may be required to apply for an entry visa to New Zealand
- > Humber transfer credit fees (\$25.00 per course, upon completion)
