TRANSCRIPT

The transcript is a subset of the student's official academic record. It lists all courses (passed, failed, withdrawn, transfer work and/or repeated courses) and any credentials awarded. Also included on the transcript are Term Totals, Earned Hours (Ehrs), GPA Hours, Quality Points (QPts), Term GPA, and an Academic Standing decision following each term where the student has completed more than six hours of course work.

Official transcripts carry the college seal, the signature of the Registrar and are sealed in official envelopes or transmitted electronically through Electronic Data Interchange (EDI).

REPEATED COURSES

Repeated courses will appear on the transcript, and the highest grade of the repeated courses will be Included (I) in the calculation of the GPA, Overall GPA, and CPGPA; and the lower graded repeated course will show as Excluded (E). The I and E indicators can be found next to the final course grade for each course.

Special Note: Effective September 2014, Humber migrated to a new student information system. All courses completed prior to September 2014 were converted into the new system with a repeat indicator of (I).

TRANSFER WORK

Transfer work (TRC) is not included in the calculation of any grade point averages. As a result of data conversion, all transfer courses (TRC) issued prior to September 2014 display with a repeat indicator of (I), however TRC is not included in any GPA calculation. Effective September 2014, transfer work will not display with any repeat indicators.

CALCULATION OF TERM GPA, OVERALL GPA, AND CPGPA

Effective September 1, 2014, Humber will publish three Grade Point Averages on the transcript: Term GPA (TGPA); Overall GPA; and Cumulative Program GPA (CPGPA).

Term GPA (TGPA) is calculated by dividing the term total amount of quality points (QPts) by the term total of GPA Hours (GPA-Hrs).

Overall GPA is calculated by summing up each term total quality points (QPts) and each term total GPA Hours (GPA-Hrs), and then dividing the total quality points (QPts) by the total GPA Hours (GPA-Hrs).

Cumulative Program GPA (CPGPA) is the same calculation as Overall GPA with the exception that only the program curriculum courses' quality points (QPts) and GPA Hours (GPA-Hrs) are used in the calculation.

Quality Points (QPts) is calculated by multiplying the final course grade by the course credits.

ACADEMIC STANDING

Effective September 1, 2014 Humber will use the Cumulative Program GPA and Term GPA to determine a student's academic standing.

GRADING SYSTEM

Grades are reported as numerical percentages out of a possible grade of 100. Unless stated otherwise in the course outline, the passing grade policy is as follows:

College Certificate/Diploma/Graduate Certificate Programs:

Prior to August 31, 2013 the passing grade was 60 per cent.
Effective September 1, 2013 the passing grade is 50 per cent.

Baccalaureate Degree Programs:

A passing grade is 50 per cent.
