Paramedics are on the front lines of emergency and critical situations, using their medical expertise, compassionate nature and ability to think on their feet to respond to emergencies and save lives.

As a graduate of the program and once certified, you may find employment:

- in Ontario's ambulance system
- with patient transfer services
- on emergency response teams
- in sports injury management services
- with potential to progress to advanced paramedical services and management

With our program, you will have the opportunity to put in-class learning to use in our biosciences/cadaver lab, through a hospital clinical placement and through a paramedic work placement, providing you with the skills needed for a challenging and rewarding career as a paramedic.

This program is not available to international applicants.

Work Placement

Students graduate with more than 550 hours combined work placement experience in both the paramedic services and acute care hospital settings. Beginning in Semester 2, students may spend blocks of time or single days in these settings, depending on the placement.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must meet all the requirements below in order to meet minimum program eligibility. Meeting minimum eligibility requirements does not guarantee an offer of admission. Admission decisions will be available via MyHumber, or by email and mail. Admission decisions will not be released by phone.

Admission selection is based on the following 4 requirements:

1. ACADEMIC

To be eligible for admission, you must possess the following:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent

or

- [Mature student status](#)

or

- [College or university transfer status](#)

and

- Results of mandatory admission testing for senior-level biology, chemistry, writing and math. Test fees will apply. For information on how to prepare for this assessment, visit the [Health Related Programs Admissions Assessment \(HHP 01\) page](#).

2. ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Humber's [English Language Proficiency Policy](#).

3. INTERNATIONAL CREDIT EVALUATION

Canadian citizens or permanent residents with international education are required to provide a WES or ICAS evaluation.

4. QUESTIONNAIRE

You will be required to answer questions and submit any current certificates (or proof of enrolment) in CPR, First Aid, NLS or Ski Patrol, through SlideRoom. SlideRoom is a secure site where additional requirements are collected, scored and stored. Log-in to <https://humber.slideroom.com> and create your free account. There will be additional instructions once your account has been created.
