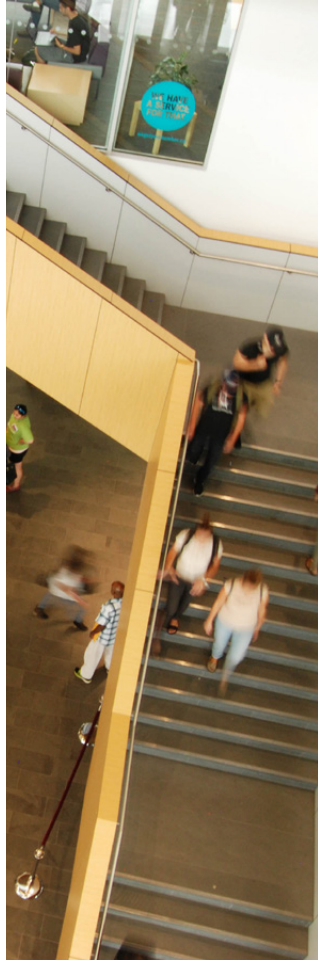

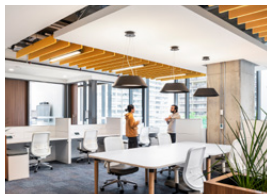

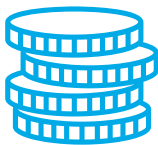

Indigenous Camp Choice provides an on-campus college experiential camp for grade 7/8 students to high school students from various First Nation communities in Ontario



The month of November is dedicated to celebrating Indigenous knowledge and culture. Hosted in November is the Annual Indigenous Knowledges Gathering which focuses on cross-cultural community building and learning.

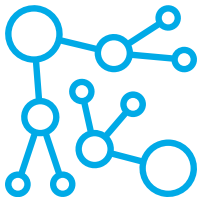
