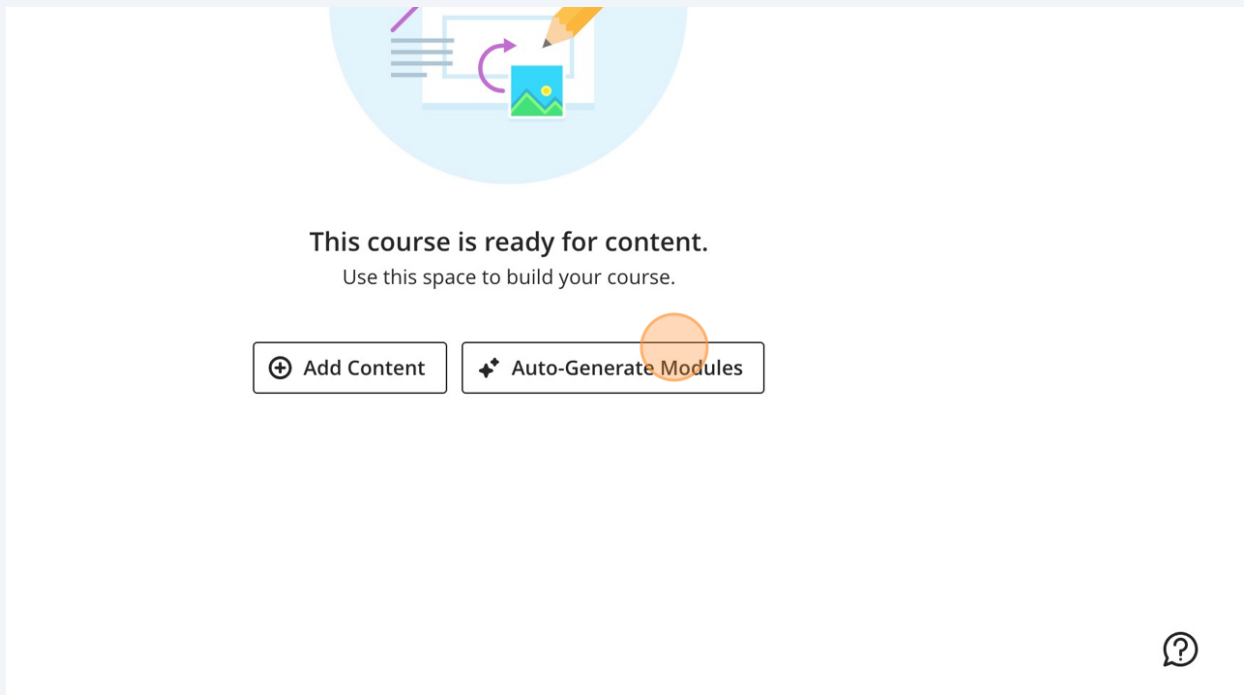


# How to use BlackBoard AI Design Assistant to Create Modules
