

How can I maintain academic integrity in an online environment?

This is a common question as we move into the Fall 2020 semester. Conversations on the prevention of plagiarism are happening right now in the higher education community; remote testing systems can track learners' movements and activity online, indicating to faculty if cheating is taking place. Humber, too, has SafeAssign built into Blackboard, automatically detecting plagiarism in written assignments.

Academic integrity is so much more than automated mechanisms desiged to identify academic misconduct. It is a reciprocal relationship between instructor and learner, and both parties have responsibilities and roles to play. How can faculty teach with integrity, and how can students learn with integrity in the online classroom?

Framed through a scholarship of teaching and learning (SoTL) lens that focuses on proactive pedagogy, our keynote address by Dr. Sarah Eaton will discuss how to uphold and enact integrity in a sustainable way. She will share strategies with faculty on how they can speak

with students about integrity through a strengths-based lens that focuses on positive and productive ways to live and learn, how faculty can integrate academic integrity into their teaching, and an integrated approach to teaching and learning that combines academic ethics with an ethic of care. You and your students are on this journey together!

Dr. Sarah Eaton is the Educational Leader in Residence for Academic Integrity and Associate Professor at the Werklund School of Education at the University of Calgary. She specializes in Educational Leadership, Policy and Governance, with a research focus on academic integrity including plagiarism, contract cheating, and academic misconduct policy.
