Academic Freedom Policy

Purpose/Rationale:

Humber College Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning (hereafter referred to as "Humber" or "the College") is committed to upholding and preserving principles of academic freedom as outlined in this policy.

Scope:

This applies to all faculty, staff and students of the College with respect to academic activities.

Definitions:

<u>Academic Freedom:</u> in accordance with Humber's Academic Regulations, academic freedom includes the freedom of research, of legitimate classroom discussion, and of the advocacy of alternative opinions to those presented in Humber's learning environments.

Policy:

- 1. All College members including faculty, staff, and students shall support and protect this fundamental principle of academic freedom and shall work collaboratively to provide an environment of tolerance and mutual respect. Every member of the College should be able to work, teach, and learn, in an atmosphere that is free from harassment and discrimination, particularly in relation to their expressed views or opinions.
- Humber requires that its members exercise academic freedom responsibly. Academic
 freedom does not relieve any member of the College from his/her obligations or duties
 inherent in the roles associated with the teaching and learning process, adherence to
 Humber policies or compliance with legislation including but not limited to the Ontario Human
 Rights Code.
- 3. It is recognized that while all employees of Humber have rights as citizens, they should make every effort when speaking or writing as citizens that they make clear that their views are their own and that they are not representing the College on matters of public interest.
