[Thunder Crashing]

Describer: At night, the flame in the industrial chimney burns dramatically while large snowflakes fall from the sky. In the daytime, the man drives his pickup truck on a snowy country road.

Father: The two-headed can was definitely a start. It was the evidence of something gone wrong.

Describer: A little blonde girl plays alone outside.

Father: You gotta get out there and really think about who you are, and what you are.

Describer: Men at work in a metal shop, massive sparks shoot out from their tools.

Father: It doesn't say in the literature that you're gonna die with your kid. But that's really what it should say.

Describer: At a time lapse speed, puffy white clouds soar above a golden yellow field. Title: Trouble in the Peace.
