

Jeff Kofman: Here's how Trint works. Trint takes audio and video files and uses artificial intelligence to convert them to text. You can transcribe recorded speech, interviews, a public hearing, a university lecture, a podcast or just your own thoughts.

JK: Hmm. What does Trint mean? Transcripton? Interview?

JK: Then we glue the original file so you can follow along and listen and if necessary, edit and correct. It's a bit like karaoke but without the painful renditions of 80's rock songs. Trint gives you a first draft transcript that's incredibly easy to edit.

JK: Click on a word to review it and if you need to change a word edit it in your Trint then you can add it to your custom dictionary for the next time. I like text in multiple colours to see the length of different sound bites and we take care of separating speakers into paragraphs.

JK: Export your Trint in all sorts of formats either one at a time or a bunch at a time. Email a copy to another Trint user or collaborate on the same transcript. You can also automatically add captions to video files with our free extension for Adobe Premiere Pro. What is said, can now be read.
