AODA Committee's Survey Response

In May 2017, the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario, the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development launched an online survey to gather public input on accessibility in education.

Survey questions were based on the following themes:

- Accessibility awareness and training
- Accessibility accommodations
- Programs, policies and program supports
- Information communication
- Inclusive decision making
- Accessible learning spaces

Committee members responded to four survey questions identified below during the AODA Committee meeting held on October 6, 2017.

What could your school, college or university do to improve awareness and consideration of the accessibility needs of persons with disabilities?

- Sometimes accommodations requested are not clear for faculty. More dialogue needed about the terms stated in the accommodation letters for faculty, so that expectations are clear
- Every school or faculty to have their own accessible learning services committee, to act as a consultation service to faculty members who are seeking recommendations on how to increase accessibility in their teaching practices
- Find ways to increase investment in an accessible culture at Humber
- Need to address attitudinal barriers through various approaches workshops, committees, hiring practices. Everyone needs to be invested in increasing accessibility
- Increase the understanding of internal and external community members (speakers, vendors, contractors) to adequately address and respond to accessibility needs when they arise
- Increase accessibility related trainings throughout the school year
- Designate specific budgets to finance accessibility related projects
- College's Advancement program can target accessibility related initiatives

What resources or policies have you seen as most effective to support awareness of accessibility needs in your school, college or university?

- The Design of Public Spaces Standard for new buildings is clear on what the institution must do to increase accessible spaces for new buildings
- Humber's teaching effectiveness program for new faculty includes a presentation on accessible resources
- Accessible Learning Services at Humber is effective increasing accessibility awareness This document is available in an alternate format upon request

- Mandated trainings under AODA
- Programs for students that provide additional supports including counselling, financial and legal aid
- Humber's Accessible Learning Services has an online portal that allows for instructors to view all their students' accommodation letters in one place (with approval from the student)
- Accessible document workshops were beneficial
- Centre's AODA information table promotes awareness to students

What challenges do students with disabilities face when accessing supports, programs or services in your school, college or university?

- Wait times in accessing accessible supports. Part-time and mature students tend to take a longer time to connect with accessible resources at the College
- There needs to be an increase in the promotion of the accessible services/resources available at the College as this informs students' decisions in the Colleges they apply too
- Lack of resources in supporting students with disabilities transitioning from postsecondary into the workforce
- Attitudinal barriers misrepresentation of what an accommodation really means, for e.g., equity vs. favoritism

In your experience what resources, tools or policies are most effective to promote awareness of the available supports?

- Student volunteers and leaders, for e.g. Easy Start Transition Ambassadors, promote the accessible services at Humber before students arrive on campus
- Public advertisements that promote accessible services and resources available at Humber College
- Mandatory legislation
- Increased spaces to learn directly from persons with disabilities
- Use of internal communication channels, for e.g. HTV ads
