

Residence Installment Dates



To maintain your space in residence, your fees must be paid by the following due dates:

- July 8, 2024: First Installment of Residence and Dining Fees Due
- November 11, 2024: Second Installment of Residence Fees Due

Early Arrival Requests

Students with exceptional circumstances may apply for an early move in through the **Residence Portal**. Early arrival requests are subject to approval and are not guaranteed. Early arrival information will be emailed to all students in early August. Approved students may check in as early as August 9, 2024.





Cancellation

If, prior to arriving, you decide NOT to move into Humber Residence, you must cancel your application in the <u>Residence Portal</u>.

Phone calls and emails are not acceptable methods of cancellation. Students who cancel AFTER August 1, 2024 forfeit their \$500 deposit <u>and</u> will be responsible for Residence Fees for up to 60 residence nights beginning Move In Day, unless a suitable external replacement is found.

Insurance

Student Property and Liability Insurance, or "Residents Insurance" is included as part of your Residence Fees. After moving into residence, the insurance company will contact you using the contact information you provided to the Residence within 60 days of the start of the semester to provide the certificate of insurance. This will be your primary property and liability insurance while living in residence.

Student Parking

Residents wishing to bring a vehicle with them to campus must purchase a parking permit. Student parking permits sell quickly so be sure to secure yours promptly. More information on student parking permits can be found <u>HERE</u>.



PLANNING FOR YOUR MOVE

What To Do What To Bring

First Year Resident Move In

Residence Move In Day for first year residents is on Sunday, August 25, 2024.

To ensure a smooth move in experience, your move in time slot is as follows:

- 8:00am Noon: Residents with last names from A-K
- Noon 4:00pm: Residents with last names from L-Z

*ALL STUDENTS: If you cannot move in by 12 p.m. noon on the first day of class, you **must** advise the Residence Office at

lakeresmail@residence.humber.ca or your space may be forfeited.

Planning For Your Move

Make sure your read the "What to Bring" section, as **items not meeting residence guidelines will be turned away.** We have had students arrive with a truckload of items which had to be sent back as there is no space! Please read this section carefully.

- Bring your own cart/dolly for moving your things in. There is usually a substantial distance from your vehicle to your room. We do not have carts available.
- Additional furnishings cannot block entrance/exit doors or vents in your room/suite. Furnishings must be free-standing and in good condition. Additional furnishings become the responsibility of the resident and are used at your own risk. Upholstered furnishings (your own mattress, futons, couches, etc.) are not permitted due to potential pest issues.

PRO TIP: Pack your items in proper boxes. Bags rip quickly!

- Unusual pieces must be approved by a Residence Manager upon move in. Unacceptable pieces must be removed immediately. All additional furnishings must be removed at the time of move out or be subjected to a disposal charge.
- Please leave your pets at home. We love pets too, however, we cannot allow pets to enter the residence buildings. Our parking lot is not shaded and can become extremely hot and dangerous for pets left in a vehicle.

What Not To Bring to Residence

- Cooking appliances, such as griddles, George Foreman type grills, hot plates, toaster ovens, deep fryers, induction stove tops, etc. Only small cooking appliances with auto shutoffs (rice cookers, air fryers, instant pots) are permitted in suite-style kitchenettes or lounges.
- Fridges of any size. Mini-fridges will be available for rent to students assigned to single and semi-suite room types from <u>Coldex</u>. Students may not supply their own fridges.
- Microwave ovens
- Large stereo/sound systems/subwoofers
- Nails or hooks with sticky tape (you may only use painter's tape)
- Pets of any kind (including fish/reptiles/insects)
- Candles or incense
- Couches, futons, or any upholstered furniture
- Beer bottles or large volume alcohol containers (such as kegs, mini kegs, Texas mickeys)
- Weapons, including BB or paint ball guns, swords, etc., including toy replicas of these items
- Fireworks, firecrackers, or other explosives



THE BIG DAY



Day Of Instructions Day Of To Dos



- 1. Arrive at the Residence on Move In Day during your assigned time slot (page 4 of this document).
- 2. Follow the signs to the residence. Park your vehicle in Lot 1, entering from 23rd Street. Map on page 2.
- 3. Leave your move in helpers in the car and walk to the Check In Tent located at the main entrance of the R Residence to check in. Once you have been checked in, you will receive your residence room key and be directed to your residence building.
- 4. Return to your vehicle. R Building Residents will be able to unload their belongings and begin moving in. AR Building Residents will receive directions for moving their vehicle to the AR Drop Off area to unload their belongings before returning their vehicle to Lot 1.
- 5. Complete the unit Inventory Inspection within 48 hours of checking in.
- 6. If you have any problems with your room, report it to the Front Desk or log a work order (instructions in next section).

Moving in AFTER 4:00pm on August 25?

- 1. Proceed to **R Building** at 3199 Lake Shore Blvd W (at the corner of Lake Shore Blvd W and 22nd Street).
- 2. Park your vehicle in Lot 1. Do not unload.
- 3. Proceed to the **R Building** Residence Front Desk to check in. Upon check in you will be provided your building assignment and directed to your room location.
- 4. Complete the unit Inventory Inspection within 48 hours of checking in.
- 5. If you have any problems with your room, report it to the Front Desk or log a work order.



Inventory Inspection

Each student must complete their room Inventory Inspection within 48 hours of checking in. To complete the Inventory Inspection, go to the Residence Portal. You must indicate the condition of the items in your room on this inspection. Your Inventory Inspection is only for comparison purposes when you move out, and is not reviewed for immediate issues or repairs. At move out you will be charged for any damages, cleaning or missing items which were not indicated on your Inventory Inspection upon move in.

Room Repairs

To report any maintenance issues, room repair requirements, or safety issues,

you MUST complete a work order through the Residence Portal or contact the Front Desk for assistance. Any urgent matters, such as water leaks, should be reported immediately to avoid damage.

Decorating Your Room

Remember that you will be held responsible for any damages to your room or suite. Do not make permanent changes, such as painting, installing tiles or permanent carpeting, putting nails in the walls or using duct tape for posters. Use painter's tape ONLY to hang your posters and photos, and remove gently to avoid damage to the paint in your room. We suggest using wall decals that cling to the wall without leaving adhesive residue on the wall. Residents are also not permitted to post or paint anything on exterior windows or doors. Each room has a bulletin board outside the room to post materials.

As stated in the Residence Code of Community Standards, no postings will be permitted on hallway and common area walls in residence. Please keep in mind that your personal bulletin board postings must be appropriate for community living standards and the comfort level of all residents.

Important Note On Guests

From 8:00a.m. on August 21 - 8:00a.m. on August 29 (i.e. Orientation), no guests will be permitted, with the exception of friends and family members who may temporarily enter the Residence to help residents with their move. Year round, minors (17 years of age and younger) are not the Age of Majority in Ontario, and are not permitted to stay as guests in residence during the overnight period of 12:00a.m. - 7:00a.m.
