PRE-ARRIVAL

Residence Installment Dates

Read all information on the [Residence Website](#).

To maintain your space in residence, your fees must be paid by the following due dates:

- **July 7, 2025:** First Installment of Residence and Dining Fees Due
- **November 10, 2025:** Second Installment of Residence Fees Due

*For a successful move in, ensure all Fall 2025 fees are paid or have a payment plan set up. You will not be able to check into residence until your account is up to date.

Early Arrival Requests

Students with exceptional circumstances may apply for an early move in through the [Residence Portal](#) beginning July 30, 2025. Early arrival requests are subject to approval and are not guaranteed. Early arrival application information will be emailed to all students.



Cancellation

If, prior to arriving, you decide **NOT** to move into Humber Residence, you must cancel your application in the [Residence Portal](#).

Phone calls and emails are not acceptable methods of cancellation. The residence deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable. In addition, students who cancel **AFTER** August 1, 2025 forfeit their \$500 deposit and will be responsible for Residence Fees for up to 60 residence nights beginning Move In Day, unless a suitable external replacement is found. Insurance

Student Property and Liability Insurance, or “Residents Insurance” is included as part of your Residence Fees. After moving into residence, **Marsh** will contact you using the contact information you provided to the Residence within 60 days of the start of the semester to provide the certificate of insurance. This will be your primary property and liability insurance while living in residence.

Student Parking

Residents wishing to bring a vehicle with them to campus must purchase a parking permit. Student parking permits sell quickly so be sure to secure yours promptly. More information on student parking permits can be found [HERE](#).

First Year Resident Move In

Residence Move In Day for first year residents is on Sunday, August 24, 2025.

To ensure a smooth move in experience, your move in time slot is as follows:

- **8:30am - 11:30am:** Residents with last names from **A-K**
- **1:00pm - 4:00pm:** Residents with last names from **L-Z**

***ALL STUDENTS:** If you cannot move in by 12 p.m. noon on the first day of class, you **must** advise the Residence Office at resmail@residence.humber.ca or your space may be forfeited.

- Unusual pieces must be approved by a Residence Management upon move in. Unacceptable pieces must be removed immediately. All additional furnishings must be removed at the time of move out or be subjected to a disposal charge.
- Please leave your pets at home. We love pets too, however, we cannot allow pets to enter the residence buildings. Our parking lot is not shaded and can become extremely hot and dangerous for pets left in a vehicle.

Planning For Your Move

Make sure you read the “What Not to Bring” section, as **items not meeting residence guidelines will be turned away**. We have had students arrive with a truckload of items which had to be sent back as there is no space!

- Bring your own cart/dolly. There is usually a substantial distance from your vehicle to your room. We do not have carts available.
- Additional furnishings cannot block entrance/exit doors or vents in your room/suite. Furnishings must be free-standing and in good condition. Additional furnishings become the responsibility of the resident and are used at your own risk. Upholstered furnishings (your own mattress, futons, couches, etc.) are not permitted due to potential pest issues.

PRO TIP: Pack your items in proper boxes. Bags rip quickly!

What **Not** To Bring to Residence

- Cooking appliances, such as griddles, George Foreman type grills, hot plates, toaster ovens, deep fryers, induction stove tops, etc. Only small cooking appliances with auto shutoffs (rice cookers, air fryers, instant pots) are permitted in suite-style kitchenettes or lounges.
- **Fridges of any size.** Mini-fridges will be available for rent to students assigned to single room type from Coldex. Students may not supply their own fridges.
- Microwave ovens
- Large stereo/sound systems/subwoofers
- Nails or hooks with sticky tape (you may only use painter's tape)
- Pets of any kind (including fish/reptiles/insects)
- Candles or incense
- Couches, futons, or any upholstered furniture
- Beer bottles or large volume alcohol containers (such as kegs, mini kegs, Texas mickeys)
- Weapons, including BB or paint ball guns, swords, etc., including toy replicas of these items
- Fireworks, firecrackers, or other explosives

What's Included in your Single Style Room

Approximate size 8'6" x 11'5" (may vary by location)

- Single bed (36" x 80")
- Space under the bed for storage containers
- Mattress and mattress protection
- Wardrobe or closet with small dresser
- Desk with chair
- Shelving above desk
- Florescent light over desk
- Curtains
- Sheet flooring (not carpeted)
- Towel bar and hooks
- Ceiling light or swing arm lamp
- Medicine cabinet with mirror
- Smoke detector
- Garbage and recycling bins

What to Bring

- Pillows
- Rubber mallet to adjust height of single bed
- Clothes Hangers
- Shoe rack
- Hair dryer and toiletries
- Flip flops and caddy for shower use
- Surge-protected, CSA-approved power bar (regular extension cords are not permitted)
- Any cords/cables that you will need for your tech devices
- Small sound system (no subwoofers or bass speakers)
- Painter's tape for hanging posters (nails or hooks with adhesives are not permitted)
- Laundry basket, laundry detergent, and dryer sheets
- TV
- Decorative items that do not damage the walls
- ID, health card, driver's license
- Small NEW throw rug
- Reusable, microwaveable dishes, cups, cutlery
- Small garbage bags for garbage & recycling bins

- Full size fridge with freezer
- Microwave
- Single sink
- Cupboards
- Kitchen table and two chairs
- Cement Style Floor

- Shower curtain (54x78 inches)
- New bathmat
- Toilet paper
- Toilet brush and cleaner
- Cleaning products
- Garbage bags
- Extra garbage can
- Mop and bucket
