The Centre for Human Rights, Equity & Diversity's (Centre) mandate is to address complaints based on the seventeen (17) grounds of discrimination as outlined by the Ontario Human Rights Code as well as Psychological Harassment/Bullying as outlined in Section 32 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act.

The seventeen (17) grounds of discrimination are outlined in the table below in random order:

Age	Marital Status	Family Status
Ancestry	Place of Origin	Citizenship
Records of Offences	Gender Identity	Gender Expression
Colour	Disability	Receipt of Public Assistance
Creed/Religion	Ethnic Origin
