Natasha Morgan has overcome many obstacles in her life, but as a result of her perseverance and positive attitude she is on the pathway to reaching her career goals.

Since childhood, Natasha knew she wanted to go to Humber College. Her dream materialized when she was accepted into the Child and Youth Worker program. This was a proud moment for Natasha — to be the only member of her family to graduate from high school and the first to enrol in a postsecondary institution.

Natasha also struggled with financial hardships. Lacking family support, she worked at three jobs while completing her high school education.



Natasha was thrilled to be chosen to receive the Montego Bay Achievers Scholarship, generously donated by the Kumaasi family. The \$1,000 scholarship was a “great relief” which allowed Natasha to cut back on the hours she worked, thus reducing the stresses that came with juggling school, work and living on her own.

Because of the scholarship, Natasha was able to focus more on her studies and she achieved honours standing in her first year — a goal which she aims to achieve again during her second year in the program.

“It is important for donors to support Humber students and help them achieve their goals,” says Natasha. “After graduating, I intend to put my diploma to good use by assisting children and youth in overcoming their own obstacles - something I can personally relate to.”
