We are pleased to announce our participation in the Accessible Content E-Portal (ACE) service managed by Scholars Portal, Ontario Council of University Libraries.

What does ACE offer?



ACE offers Humber students and faculty with perceptual disabilities access to print books from our library collection that have been digitized in five different formats.

Eligible users can search the ACE portal for the books that are already digitized and request to have specific library titles added to the portal.
