Dr. Lisa Salem-Wiseman has been an active and engaged member of the Humber community for 18 years. During that time, she has been a Faculty Member, a Program Coordinator, and an Associate Dean.

In her current secondment as Special Advisor, Humber Learning Outcomes, she works closely with all Academic Faculties, across all campuses, to facilitate the braiding of Indigenous Knowledges; Equity, Diversity and Inclusion; Sustainability; and Systems Thinking into curriculum. To do this work, Lisa collaborates with many departments across Humber, including Indigenous Education and Engagement, Humber Global, Student and Community Engagement, Humber Sustainability, the Humber Arboretum, the Centres of Innovation Network, and the Humber International Graduate Centre.

As an Associate Dean in the Faculty of Health Sciences and Wellness, Lisa led several innovative initiatives within the Inclusive and Responsive Education cluster of programs, including braiding Indigenous Knowledges throughout curriculum, revising curriculum through an antiracist and anticolonial lens, increasing global learning opportunities for students, and launching a land-based course that uses a Two-Eyed Seeing approach and is co-taught by Indigenous and non-Indigenous faculty.

Lisa is a member of the EDI Task Force and sits on the Access and Equity Employees and the Curriculum and Programs Working Groups. She serves as co-facilitator of the Sustainability Steering Committee and The Unlearning Circle and was a member of Humber College Council from 2010 to 2016. If chosen as Humber's Administrative Representative on the Board of Governors, Lisa's experience gives her the tools to represent and advocate for the diverse perspectives of this group.
