TIF AROUND TOWN

Faculty engaged in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning have been sharing their research findings far and wide. Check out the latest places faculty have been disseminating their work!



On the latest episode of the NEXTcast podcast, Louise Zimanyi (SHS) discusses the Forest and Nature Program she helped to create, and about research she has done on the impact of the program through the Teaching Innovation Fund. She also published an article about it at TheConversation.com, and has a paper under review for publication in a scholarly journal.



Tammy Cameron (SHS) will be presenting her research on exam invigilator training at the Canadian Symposium on Academic Integrity in Calgary, Alberta, this April.



Cheryl Mitchell (TBS) presented her research on entrepreneurial learning at the Annual Conference of the International Society for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (ISSOTL) in Bergen, Norway in October, 2018. Cheryl also dropped by the NEXTcast studio to discuss her TIF project. The episode will air on February 6, 2019.



It was 'standing room only' at last month's SoTL Lunch & Learn, when Bernadette Summers (SHS) shared her TIF research findings on Effective Online Course Design. She also presented her work at the "Heads of Continuing Education" Conference, this past November.



Adam Thomas (SMSIT) presented his research on 'Learning Code through Tangible Aids' at the Annual Conference of the International Society for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (ISSOTL) in Bergen, Norway in October 2018. He has also published a paper on the subject in JIPE.



Six Humber faculty have submitted abstracts of their Teaching Innovation Fund projects for consideration at the 2019 Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education Conference in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Last year, Humber had the most SoTL presentations out of all of the Canadian Colleges!



With sponsorship from the Teaching Innovation Fund, Arun Dhanota (SSCS) and Dan Rowe (SMSIT) made a Documentary on Mental Illness: The Experience of Survivors and their Caregivers. A screening of the film will be held in March, 2019. Stay tuned for more details in next month's issue.
