

Certificate Programs

IL offers a comprehensive range of Adult Educator Certificates for Humber faculty. These offerings are designed to enhance Humber faculty's skills and knowledge, ensuring they can effectively support diverse learning needs and contexts.

- <u>Inclusive Curricular Design Certificate (ICDC)</u> explores the Universal Design Learning (EDL) framework to learn to create robust and accessible learning experiences for all your students founded on the principles of equity, collaboration, flexibility and accountability.
- <u>Culturally Inclusive Educator Certificate (CIEC)</u> helps strengthen and enhance participants' intercultural awareness while developing strategies to enhance their knowledge and skills in intercultural understanding, communication and curriculum development.
- <u>Teaching Effectiveness Certificate (TEC)</u> provides participants with an opportunity to develop essential teaching competencies by exploring and applying effective teaching and learning practices as they transition into their fulltime teaching roles.

Humber Learning Outcomes

The Humber Learning Outcomes Framework is the foundation of Humber strategic plan sharing the skills and mindsets essential to develop career ready citizens. - **Facilitating Learning** engages faculty to think about the strategies to create impactful and intentional learning experiences while considering how the facilitation of content can support learning professional development.
- **Curriculum Design & Development** focuses on ways to plan and create a well-designed and thoughtfully sequenced curriculum for a course or program.
- **Teaching and Learning in HyFlex Environments** introduces faculty to the methods, practices and tools for adapting an existing in-person lesson plan for HyFlex teaching to create an engaging learning experience for students.
- Assessments for Learning considers ways to design and deliver assessments in the teaching and learning cycle to ensure that they are part of the learning process instead of a product of learning.
- Educational Technology and Accessibility is an introductory course to accessibility, applications with technology and how these considerations can increase inclusion for all learners.
- Equity and Anti-Oppressive Teaching in Post-Secondary Education intends
 to build capacity among Humber staff to become familiar with the core tenets
 of equitable and anti-oppressive teaching, including identifying one's own
 positionality, distinguishing between equality and equity, and engaging in
 critical self-reflexivity.
