

Cutting

In 2017, the CTL piloted a new collaborative approach to educational development, innovation, and research, called Cutting EDge. In this initiative, the SoTL, Professional Learning, and Digital Learning teams united to provide a support-rich opportunity for faculty to experiment with and integrate a new technology-enhanced approach in their classrooms. Faculty were trained not only how to use several new tech tools, but also about best practices from the literature. Over the course of the semester, each faculty member tried three tools, each time with in-class support and training. To document the impact, the SoTL team recruited each faculty member's students, and survey data were collected on perceived quality of classroom interactions and engagement. Focus groups were also conducted with faculty, to gather responses about their perceived quality of classroom interactions, their students' engagement, and the impact on their teaching practices.
