- Earn PD Credits towards your HRPA or CPA accreditation

Mentors are needed from many occupations, including IT / Business (Supply Chain/Project Management), Sales/Marketing, Finance and Accounting, Engineering/Architecture, Healthcare, Research and Development, Media/Communications/Public Relations, Human Resources, Social Services, Education, etc. - all the skills that we have at Humber.
