

# TEACHING IN A DIGITAL WORLD CERTIFICATE

Online

The **Teaching in a Digital World Certificate** program is designed to meet the needs of a diverse group of learners with varying degrees of teaching experience in the online and/or hybrid environment. While teaching in an online environment shares many characteristics with face-to-face teaching, it is a fundamentally different educational experience for instructors and students.

The certificate is comprised of three sequential individual courses that are designed to develop essential online teaching competencies. Participants engage as a learner, facilitator, and beginner developer over the three (3) courses.

Courses are only available online. Upon successful completion of all the courses, participants receive a Certificate of Completion.

**Courses must be taken in the following order: DEV. 014, DEV. 117, DEV. 118.**

# TEACHING IN A DIGITAL WORLD CERTIFICATE

## **DEV. 014 Clinic for Learning Management Systems**

This clinic is designed for the beginner, intermediate, and experienced Learning Management System users. Participants will focus on developing the skills required to use a Learning Management System (LMS) to effectively deliver face-to-face, hybrid and online courses. The clinic provides faculty members with the opportunity to become familiar with the student experience from pre-to post registration. In doing so, participants are introduced to effective communication techniques and strategies for using the tools of the learning management system to create a supportive and engaging learning environment. Participants are expected to apply the material in this clinic to their own face-to-face and online/hybrid course sites.

## **DEV. 117 Teaching in a Digital World - Part 1**

This course is designed to meet the needs of a diverse group of learners with varying degrees of teaching experience in the online and/or hybrid environment. While teaching in an online environment shares many characteristics with face-to-face teaching, it is a fundamentally different educational experience for instructors and students. Whether you are a novice or an experienced learner, you will assess your personal readiness for the online world, what motivates students to learn online, and how to plan and map your course for the online teaching environment. Further, you will explore current best practices and technological tools that can easily be incorporated into your current practice. Participants must take DEV.014 as a pre requisite or apply to PLAR the outcomes.

## **DEV. 118 Teaching in the Digital World - Part 2**

This course is designed as the final piece of the Teaching in the Digital World Certification. Like the previous courses it is designed to meet the needs of a diverse group of learners with varying degrees of teaching experience in the online and/or hybrid environment. This course will take a hands on approach and have students move from the planning stages of online course development to the execution of an online teaching module. Further, you will apply pedagogical strategies and technical strategies with a focus on creating a social network and engagement among members in your learning community. This course will take an in-depth look into the resources available for you to create an engaging online module. Participants must take DEV.014 and DEV.117 as a pre requisite or apply to PLAR the outcomes.
