96.9 Radio Humber is an All-Canadian campus community station based out of Humber College's North Campus in Toronto. This new state-of-the-art-facility and studio took the team of Dean Sinclair (station manager), Michael Wright (director of broadcast services), and Gokmen Gurdal (broadcast engineer) about seven months to build. The old board became inoperable and unfixable, which resulted in the studio's being gutted, refreshed with new paint, carpet, vibrant red acoustic panels, and all new gear.

Wheatstone technology now powers 96.9 Radio Humber, with the centerpiece being the Wheatstone LXE console/control surface. Other components include:

Wheatstone Blade 3 technology powers Radio Humber, with the centerpiece being the Wheatstone LXE console/control surface. The studio employs Genelec audio monitors and Rode NT2-A microphones, AirAura X3 audio processing, and Yellowtec M!ka microphone and monitor arms. The new automation system features RCS Zetta for seamless operation.
