**Question 1: What could Humber do to better prepare you for your future career?**

- Increase the number of placements in each program and provide hands-on learning in the classroom
- Provide more support to finding work placements
- Ensure diversity among Humber professors and have faculty be grounded in the subject matters they teach (e.g., Indigenous faculty teaching Indigenous courses)
- Increase opportunities to meet/network with industry (e.g., lecturers, online forums/events, alumni) so students can learn more about the career options in their fields
- Reassess the skills being taught in each program to ensure they encompass those employers require (e.g., documentation skills, Excel)

**Question 2: How can Humber use technology and digital resources to improve your learning experiences?**

- Better link students and faculty to the resources that support digital learning (e.g., “how to” guides and immediate technology support)
- Reassess the new LMS (BlackBoard Ultra) navigation and email organization to make it more user-friendly (e.g., have documents open immediately rather than require they be downloaded; create a separation between inbox and sent messages)
- Use technology to engage students during classes (e.g., use videos, photos, links, break out groups, and BlackBoard to connect students for collaboration)
- Ensure faculty are trained to use and leverage the technology to deliver an enhanced virtual experience

**Question 3: What one big thing could Humber do to set it apart from all other colleges and polytechnic institutions in the province?**

- Provide multiple opportunities for students to obtain experience in their fields (e.g., student run magazine that is part of your program)
- Attach each program to a specific offering or initiative (e.g., “sustainable closet” for Fashion) and to a centre of innovation and excellence with opportunities for students to engage with them
- Offer multiple delivery methods (in-person, online learning, hybrid) so that students can choose how they want to interface with their program
- Reduce tuition during times like COVID-19
