HLO Sustainability Connection

The HLOs were created by consulting Humber staff, faculty, and students about what skills and mindsets they believed were essential for graduates to develop. The topic of sustainability came up quite a bit and Sarah's team knew it would be essential to include in the framework.

A key part of the HLOs is the Sustainability Literacy Assessment, which measures the knowledge students gain of sustainability during their time at Humber.
